

Arrival at the SIXTH AVENUE INN in the heart of downtown Seattle. We will have convenient access to local attractions with 2 different shopping centers/malls within 2-1/2 blocks, including Nordstrom's landmark store, and Pike Place Market a mere 6 block walk. It's ½ block from the big Westin twin Towers in downtown Seattle, with airport shuttles available. There is a restaurant located in the Sixth Avenue Inn as well as many other restaurants within walking distance.

THURS 18 SEPT 2008:

SPACE NEEDLE: Take the elevated MONORAIL to Seattle Center and go up 520 ft to the Space Needle Observation Deck for a 360 degree view of Mt. Rainier to the south, the Cascade Mountains to the east, the Olympic Mountains to the west and a lofty view of downtown Seattle, its seaside activities including ferries, cruise lines, cargo ships, and float planes. FERRY ride to Bremerton (1 hour each way)

USS TURNER JOY, DD951. The Turner Joy is a Forrest Sherman class destroyer built at Seattle in August 1959. We will have our **MEMORIAL SERVICE** on board the Turner Joy, then tour her before lunch. After lunch, options are to continue touring the ship or catch a ferry back to Seattle for an free afternoon of shopping along the piers of Elliott Bay—lunch on your own. www.ussturnerjoy.com

SS VIRGINIA V: Board this 85 year old steamship for an excursion around Lakes Union and Washington. Once part of a large "Mosquito Fleet" of vessels which served waterfront towns all over Puget Sound, she evokes the sights, sounds, and feelings of steamship passage from another era. Sunday morning set sail on the VICTORIA CLIPPER high-speed catamaran traveling through Puget Sound enjoying a Champagne breakfast arriving at the Inner Harbor in VICTORIA, BC, CANADA, for an overnight stay at the Grand Pacific Hotel. This delightful city is steeped in British tradition. Sunday afternoon will be free to explore on your own around the harbor and city. On Monday there will be a tour of the city and a visit to the Butchart Gardens, a 55-acre floral splendor begun in 1904. Return to Seattle Monday at 8:45 pm aboard the Clipper. You may want to reserve another night at the Sixth Avenue Inn. **Passport required.** We have enough people registered to book the trip. **If you plan to go to Victoria, BC, Canada, please include your full name, gender, and date of birth. Downtown Airporter Shuttle—the Sixth Avenue Inn is less than one block from the Westin Hotel where the Shuttle arrives and departs every half hour to and from the airport. From the airport, the shuttle departs 21 and 51 minutes after each hour from 5:21 am to 11:21 pm. Costs is \$10.25 per person one way.



Arlington Cemetery Tomb of the Unknown Soldier

The guard at the tomb takes 21 steps before making his turn. The 21 steps allude to the twenty-one gun salute which is the highest honor given any military or foreign dignitary. He hesitates 21 seconds after his about face to begin his return walk.

The guard's gloves are wet to prevent losing his grip on the rifle. He carries the rifle on the shoulder away from the tomb. After his march across the path, he executes an about face and moves the rifle to the outside shoulder. The guards are changed every thirty minutes, twenty-four hours a day, 365 days a year.

Guards must commit two years to the guard service and live in a barracks under the tomb. They cannot drink alcohol on or off duty for the rest of their lives and cannot swear in public or disgrace the uniform in any way. After two years, the guard is given a wreath pin that is worn on their lapel signifying they served as guard of the tomb. There are only 400 presently worn. If the rules are not obeyed for the rest of their lives, they give up the wreath pin.
