Join Us For The 28th Uss Stoddard Reunion

Freeport, Maine

The town of Freeport Maine is best known for outlet stores and LL Bean. It was voted the "Best Weekend of Shopping in New England" by Yankee Magazine Readers for the second year in a row. Be-



yond being a shopper's paradise, the town of Freeport is also known as The Birthplace of Maine. Colonists used to gather for meetings at Jameson Tavern. Many historical buildings are still standing in Freeport thanks to the local historical society, including many original homes, schools and churches.

In addition there will be a tour of Maine Maritime Museum and a cruise past the historic Bath Iron Works Shipyard, which has built vessels since 1884. The Bath Iron Works built Fletcher Class destroyers during WWII. The Fletcher class destroyers were on of the shipbuilding success stories of WWII, bringing together endurance, speed and firepower. Several BIW-built ships served with particular distinction in the Pacific. The USS Nicholas DD-449 was the most decorated ship in history. Between February 1942 and November 1943 BIW launched no fewer than 32 Fletcher Class ships. Most of us remember the USS Braine DD-630, USS Cogswell DD-651 and USS Ingersoll DD-652 all were built by Bath Iron Works. The Bath Iron Works is now working on the Zumwalt and Arleigh Burke Class Destroyers.



The USS Zumwalt DDG-1000 was christen recently and it is possible we might see her or her sister ship the new DDG-1001 on our cruise by the shipbuilding plant.



Kennebunkport, Maine

The town center, the area in and around Dock Square, is located along the Kennebunk River. Historically a shipbuilding and fishing village, for well over a century the town has been a popular summer colony and seaside tourist destination. The Dock Square area has a district of souvenir shops, art galleries, seafood restaurants, and bed and breakfasts.

Our hosts arranged for a Lobster bake with entertainment at Fosters, stop at Nubble Lighthouse, and time in Old Port.

Letter from Frank Kasmarski (MM3 1964-1968) to the Veterans Administration

I request that the USS Stoddard DD566 be put on the 211 AOSHIPSLIST. The attached ships logs clearly indicate that the ship was in Saigon River & the Mekong Delta. I have submitted these logs over 2 years ago and to date have not been added to the list. Per Training Letter 10-06 Department of Veterans Affairs it clearly states that "anchoring in one of these locations is not the same as anchored in an open water port; these are inland water ways. When deck logs refer to anchoring in the "mouth" of one of these locations, or any other indentifiable river location, C&P Service has determined that this is sufficient to establish service on the inland water ways".

Your immediate attention to this matter will be greatly appreciated.



Response from Veterans Administration Mr. Kasmarski,

Very sorry for the delayed response. Thanks for the deck log information on the Saigon River. I am adding the ship as shown below. However, my research on Point Kega shows that it is not inland but rather is a coastal point halfway between Vung Tau and Phan Thiet.

<u>USS Stoddard (DD-566)</u> operated on Saigon River during September 1965.

USS Stoddard Deck Logs submitted to VA also show Stoddard anchored in Saigon River – Sept.3rd 1965. As of the date of this January 2016 newsletter the USS Stoddard has not been added to the 211 AOSHIPSLIST. As soon as we receive word we will let the USS Stoddard Alumni know in the our newsletter. Stoddard History—September 2, 1945 Japanese Surrender at Tokyo Bay


The surrender of the Empire of Japan was announced by Imperial Japan on August 15 and formally signed on September 2, 1945, bringing the hostilities of World War II to a close. By the end of July 1945, the Imperial Japanese Navy was incapable of conducting major operations and an Allied invasion of Japan was imminent. Together with the United Kingdom and China, the United States called for the unconditional surrender of the Japanese armed forces in the Potsdam Declaration on July 26, 1945—the alternative being "prompt and utter destruction". While publicly stating their intent to fight on to the bitter end, Japan's leaders (the Supreme Council for the Direction of the War, also known as the "Big Six") were privately making entreaties to the still-neutral Soviet Union to mediate peace on terms more favorable to the Japanese. Meanwhile, the Soviets were preparing to attack Japanese forces in Manchuria and Korea (in addition to southern Sakhalin and the Kurile Islands) in fulfillment of promises they had secretly made to the United States and the United Kingdom at the Tehran and Yalta Conferences.



The surrender ceremony was held on September 2, aboard the United States Navy battleship *USS Missouri* (BB-63), at which officials from the Japanese government signed the Japanese Instrument of Surrender, thereby ending the hostilities. Allied civilians and military personnel alike celebrated V-J Day, the end of the war; however, some isolated soldiers and personnel from Imperial Japan's farflung forces throughout Asia and the Pacific islands refused to surrender for months and years afterwards, some even refusing into the 1970s. The role of the atomic bombings in Japan's surrender, and the ethics of the two attacks, is still debated. The state of war formally ended when the Treaty of San Francisco came into force on April 28, 1952. Four more years passed before Japan and the Soviet Union signed the Soviet—Japanese Joint Declaration of 1956, which formally brought an end to their state of war.

USS Stoddard was there during the signing and received the certificate below:
